Report of Career Counseling and Guidance for preparation for Competitive Exams:

2018 - 2019- For Interns and Final year part I and part II MBBS Students.

Medical career path is a challenging journey into relentless continuous learning and strong will power, sheer determination is needed at every step in this career. Giving young people the tools and knowledge to plan for their future is a primary goal of education. With this goal in mind, a career development awareness seminar was organized by the Management of SRMC Medical College on 17.07.2018 and 27.06.2019 in the SRMC Campus.

The session "**Crack with knack- how to prepare NEET PG Exams**" focused on bringing awareness about the consistent preparation and core commitment being the key to success in NEET PG. The program was flagged off by the inaugural speech by our Honourable Chairman Dr. M. Santhiramudu. The speaker invited was Dr. Kranti Chaitanya, a young dynamic Cardiologist of AP state, who shared his mantra- 3 Rs: READ, REVISE, and RECALL which helped him in achieving his academic dreams. Specifically, students in lower academic levels wanted interaction with personnel from various medical health professions and in-depth counseling. Students in the higher academic levels, however, desired to meet personnel from specific career choices, field experiences, and in-depth guidance for career decisions. The need for tailoring career coaching programs according to academic performance levels was also discussed.

The seminar was attended by 100 Intern students and 204(a total of **304**) Final Year part I and part II students. Their participant's enthusiasm was overwhelming throughout the two hours of interactive session. The speakers were open to take audience questions and encouraged the audience to put-forth their queries. The speaker also shared life tips and information on how to navigate through the various competitive exams to achieve success in the public service examinations.
